REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS AND OFFICIALS

Mrs. Horner stated that the Parks & Recreation Department has openings for adult men's and co-ed summer softball. Baseball, softball and t-ball youth registration is going on now through March 15. Registration is also currently open for their Spring Break Camp and also for their Aquatic Easter Egg Hunt event that is coming up Saturday, March 18 and lastly the Spring/Summer Brochure will be mailed out the first week of March.

Ms. Sorensen stated that she just wanted to remind everybody that tomorrow there is an Open House and Ribbon Cutting for a new business that we have in town here just north of the City Campus. It is a gentleman, Dr. Lang, he is known as Dr. Lang, but it is Personalized Primary Care and he is also housing 2 other businesses, Audiology and Assoc. and Lava Massage. It is kind of a nice business that compliments the city center that we are trying to create and the Special Planning District and they marry pretty well with Danbury and The Avenue which she knows that they are looking to do a lot of business with so anybody who wants to come out and support them, come check them out 4:30 -6:00 p.m. tomorrow.

Mr. Skvasik stated that in view of the nice weather they have seen a good constant stream of permits being taken so there has been a fair amount of business activity in view of the nice weather. Also, Kevin Machesky our Property Maintenance Inspector has been very active since he started back to work. Mr. Stelmaschuk responded that he goes from Royalwood to Broadview to Wallings and then a little bit on the Royalton borderline. She asked Mayor Alai which he responded stating that he represents the whole city. Mr. Ruffa responded that he is not a politician. Mr. Boldt stated that he is the President of Council and also the Ward 4 Council representative which is Royalwood south and west of Broadview Road and half of New Hampton. Mr. Boldt stated that the next question that he gets from all of the students is the Boards and Commissions are on the website. The Ward map is also on the website. They also said that there is a map on the wall of the hall which shows the wards also. Mrs. Dunlap stated that she is their secretary. Mr. Wolf stated that he represents Ward 2 and he asked Ms. Bartko if she knows what Ward she lives in and she responded no and Mr. Wolf stated that she is in Ward 2. Mr. Pavlica stated that he represents Ward 1. Mr. Goodwin stated he is council at-large which is the whole city. Ms. Bartko asked about one of the topics discussed, for 2017-22 first reading, does that mean that council all adopted it so that it is now a law now. Mayor Alai stated that once they sign it it will be. Ms. Bartko asked why council did on certain ones just read them and then for other ones they took 2 votes. Mr. Boldt stated that first they suspended Council Rules and they placed it on the agenda. They voted on that. If you have a majority of Council that wants to vote on it they would vote affirmative for it and so they proceed. Now if the majority of Council didn't vote for it, it would stop there and you would only do a first reading. The second time that they voted was for the passage. The other ones that they only did a first reading on, that was because some of the language in those, we need to check prior to voting on.

Bob Price, 1153 Fireside Trail: He is just here on behalf of his son Dustin Baer who lives at 1880 W. Edgerton and Dustin received approval to do an addition on his house. A week or so ago they started construction and today he received an order through their contractor that they were told to stop construction.


Mr. Boldt asked if he could get Mr. Price with the Building Commissioner and the Law Director afterwards and they can discuss that.
