REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM DEPARTMENT HEADS AND OFFICIALS

Mrs. Horner stated that she just wanted to announce that the recreation center will be closed on July 4th but the Splash Park will be open weather permitting. Also there is a special concert this Friday, July 6th the summer concert

and the Splash Park will be closed all day. A few events coming up, the Mayor Alai's 5K and 1 mile walk is Sunday, July 15th along with the Community Pancake Breakfast, also the Broadview Heights outdoor movie night featuring the Disney movie Coco will be held on Saturday, August 4th and the Broadview Heights night with the Cleveland Indians will be held on August 17th. More information on all of those events are available on our website and lastly she would like to announce that the Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening for the new Broadview Heights Community and Recreation Center is tentatively scheduled for Saturday, November 3rd. More information on this event will be available soon but please save the date.

Mrs. Washabaugh stated that she would just like to ask everybody to keep Mr. & Mrs. Leo Bender, former Mayor in their thoughts. Many of you have heard about the boating accident between the Bahamas and Nassau this past weekend. They did have a son on the boat that exploded with his wife and his 2 stepchildren. 3 out of 4 members are doing semi okay right now and she will let everyone know if she hears anything else.

Mr. Schroedel stated that the road crews are continuing their work in New Hampton with catch basins and he appreciates the email that Mr. Pavlica forwarded. It is good to hear good news sometimes and they are doing a large big job on Wyatt Road replacing a storm pipe along the road going through about 3 houses and this Thursday they will be in full force starting set up for Home Days.

Mr. Yelenosky stated that he just wanted to update council on Overlook and Wright Roads construction. This past Saturday they tied the water line in around 2:00 p.m. it was up and running which they started at 4:00 a.m. Catts Construction and the Police Department did a good job. Also the 3rd week of July they expect to start Rt. 82, there is the 4 lane section from where our I-77 ramp modification project ended and we Brecksville stopped their construction and we will be doing prep work so expect delays in that area. If you see 2 individuals out there with his department inspecting culverts they are going to try to do that on an annual basis and make sure that they are in good operating order and he just heard from Ms. Sorensen that Monday July 9th that they are going to start the construction and shut down Harris Road Bridge.

Ms. Sorensen stated that she would like to thank the council members that came out last week to show support for Bistro 82 with the Ribbon Cutting. It was a nice ceremony and the owners appreciated it. This summer coming up they are going to have a couple of ribbon cuttings to be busy during the break, first will be Wild Eagle on July 23rd, Club Palates on July 30th, State Farm Agent Erin Schwan's new office on August 1st and Sher Smiles Orthodontics some time the week of August 6th so she will be sure to keep everybody updated on that. Also the Night in the Heights Concert Series, the second concert of the summer will be this Friday at 7:00 p.m. and it is free to everybody. The band that is going to be playing is Pants on Fire and they do covers from 1990-2000, modern day, anything from Tom Petty to Flash Pearl Jam and the Farmer's Market is in full swing all summer on Saturday's from 9-1 and Home Days is next week so it is a busy summer.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Mr. Boldt stated that last Wednesday the Planning Commission met. There were 3 unanimous approvals, Primrose had 2 and Danny Boys had 1.

Mr. Price stated that just a reminder that the BZA meeting will be held the second Wednesday this month which will be July 11th at 6:30 p.m. and he will be in attendance.

Ms. Mahnic stated that Service/Safety did have a meeting this evening and they discussed the Pin Oaks development and there were a few issues that they had so they did not grant them final approval. They made a motion to get final review from the Fire and Police departments because they did not have that and one of the hydrants were physically missing. Also they want final storm water calculations and verified while working with their engineering company. They had also learned that in approximately 2005 that the Planning Commission may have required that they property next to Pin Oaks was supposed to put in a fence. This fence would help block lighting from cars into other resident's homes so they have asked the Law Department to look into that and she spoke to Mr. Ruffa before the meeting. Then they asked them to submit a lighting plan because there was no additional lighting like if people were walking their dogs or something of that nature for the nighttime in that area and they asked them to also submit a landscaping plan to make sure that they are avoiding any kind of lines or pipes that may need to be accessed in the future. So lots of discussion and new information so they will be going to Planning Commission and kind of doing these other things and when they hear back that all of those things have been addressed they may meet during summer recess or if it doesn't get done until they are back then it doesn't get done until they are back.

Mr. Pavlica stated that the Civil Service did meet June 19th and some of the items discussed was that they are looking into hiring 3 new officers in the near future here and they discussed that the Police Exam taken is good until October of 2018 and they discussed some retirees coming up.

PRESENTATION FROM BRECKSVILLE-BROADVIEW HEIGHTS CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

Ms. Joelle Magyar stated that she is here this evening in a collaborative spirit to briefly share with you some important next moves as it relates to our new Pre-K to 5 elementary planning and construction process. Before she goes any further she would like to thank Mayor Sam Alai and members of council who supported Issue 3 back in May. Passing this issue was an important first step. In the last 45 days or so a great deal of behind the scenes work has taken place such as getting the bonds ready for sale, locating deeds for land in agreement with the City of Brecksville and completing legal contracts and other documentation. Later this month a team from the school district will travel to Chicago to present at Moody's to secure a solid bond rating before going out to market which will happen around September 11th. Please keep in mind that this project will be a 3 year process. Year 1 is planning and design which the architects call visioning, year 2-3 will be construction. There will be much to communicate over the coming months and she shares with you 2 important dates that have been already scheduled. Wednesday, August 22, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. at the High School Media Center there will be a meet the architect's night where the public can meet officials

from Then Design or TDA to learn more about their process. On Tuesday, September 18, 2018 they will host their first of many visioning sessions with the community. She will email Mayor Alai with those dates so that you can be aware and hopefully attend and participate. Her specific purpose for being here tonight is to respectfully appear before council as a curtesy among public officials to share one important development which has emerged over the last few weeks since the bonds passage and that is at the regular meeting on July 16, 2018 the Board of Education is expected to consider an agreement that will permit the construction of a shared use facility that will connect the elementary school to a City of Brecksville owned, operated and financed field house. The district views the attachment as extremely advantages for 3 important reasons. First creating a shared use facility could allow the district to invest more dollars into the classroom space. To be clear, the City of Brecksville will entirely pay for the construction costs of the field house portion of the facility and in addition has agreed to pay for the initial prep work of the site. All additional costs with the site such as environmental testing, soil testing will be split at a 50/50 cost between the City of Brecksville and the schools. They anticipate this site prep work cost to be a savings of 8% of the total cost or approximately \$3.1 million saved by the school district. Because the City of Brecksville will be constructing a fully equipped stated of the art field house the district would no longer need to construct its own gymnasium saving the district approximately \$1.6 million in construction costs. In addition, not having our own gymnasium could also save the district approximately \$32,000 per month in ongoing utility, personnel and operating costs. Every dollar saved by the potential arrangement for the City of Brecksville to pay for the initial site work prep and the gymnasium amenities is a dollar that can be invested in the classroom, into innovation and technology for future students a first rate education experience. Furthermore, the schools could realize a real cost savings by combining construction efforts with the City of Brecksville for materials, project management and other economies of scale. Second, creating a shared use facility permits an even heightened level of security for our students. In the initial discussions, the City of Brecksville agreed that during the regular school year approximately 180 days the field house would be closed to the public during school hours to accommodate the schools need for exclusivity of gymnasium time. There will be no co-mingling of public with students in any point during the school year, on schools days, during school hours. The facility will feature safe and secure entrances throughout the campus and separate secure entrances will be constructed on each facility. The elementary facility will most likely be connected to the field house for what is called a cafatorium, a common space that combines a cafeteria with an auditorium. Both ends of this cafatorium features safe and secure entrances to the respected public entities facility. Finally the school district views this shared use facility as highly beneficial due to the opportunities for collaboration that emerge not only with the City of Brecksville but with the Metro Parks with whom they have already met to discuss a trailhead system through the woodlands for outdoor educational opportunities and connectivity possibilities as well as outdoor learning spaces and storm water conservation. They hope that such collaboration would lead to a trail system that connects the school system with the City of Broadview Heights campus further enhancing the districts relationship with all of us. To close this is a very top level summary but one that she wanted to deliver in person. They have legal experts working on a potential development agreement right now who have done this successfully for other joint shared use facilities in our area such as in Independence and the Willoughby/Eastlake City Schools. In both of those examples the shared use facility are regarded as crown jewels in their communities and for their students. That is her goal, to provide our students with the very best educational experience possible. Because of the cost savings which translates into more dollars into the classroom, because of the enhanced level of safety and security and because of these continued opportunities for collaboration they hope that we agree that the shared use facility can be a win win for everyone.

Mr. Price stated great news about the savings on the project but why not pass the savings back to the taxpayers. Was this not to construct a new school and now we are using it for curriculum and other components? Has their Law Director said that the funds can still be used for that?

Ms. Magyar stated that she does not understand his question.

Mr. Price asked what they funded in that bond levy.

Ms. Magyar stated approximately the \$44.5 million, \$39 million was slated for the elementary school that would include all of those costs that she talked about, prepping the site, having to build a gymnasium and all of those things are included in that price so by them sharing those costs it reduces those costs and they will be able to take those moneys and put them into other areas of the building. She will give you an example, furniture for their building can cost anywhere from \$4 a square foot to \$16 a square foot. That savings that they have may get them in that range where they may not have to spend the \$4 but could spend closer to the \$10 per square foot for furniture if that is need be. Any time that you bid a project you do not know what your bids are going to come back to so it gives them a little bit of flexibility. That might be something that they choose to do at the end of the project when they see where their costs lay.

Mr. Price stated that he appreciates that. He just thinks that when do they think out of the box and actually give money back to the taxpayers, just a question that he would like to ask.

Ms. Magyar stated great question.

Ms. Mahnic stated that this is the first that she is hearing of it so forgive her for maybe not knowing the answer and it might be addressed, but will the residents of Broadview Heights or the residents that specifically use that school district be able to utilize this after hours.

Ms. Magyar asked the rec facility.

Ms. Mahnic stated yes.

Ms. Magyar stated that it is going to be run strictly by the City of Brecksville so the kids that attend the elementary school will have use of that facility during their school day, during the school year.

Ms. Mahnic asked they will not have access to it after school hours.

Ms. Magyar stated that is going to be completely up to the City of Brecksville of how they utilize that.
