



Critical for Affordable and Accessible Community Parks and Recreation Services

There will be a temporary, 0.7 mill operating levy on the ballot this November.

Residents would pay **ONLY \$2.04** per month per \$100,000 property valuation!

Critical for:

- Operating the new Community and Recreation Center, which will include:
 - ✓ A new 7,000-sq. foot fitness center
 - ✓ A new 11,080-sq. foot gymnasium with 2 full size courts and an elevated 3-lane track
 - ✓ A new 8,347 sf natatorium which includes: (4) 25-meter lap lanes, a lazy river, social/program area, a zero depth entry area with a play structure and water features, waterslide, whirlpool spa, steam/sauna rooms, an aquatic climbing wall, basketball hoops and volleyball
 - ✓ A new lobby, locker rooms, childcare space, party/community rooms and casual activity space with vending
- Keeping recreation center memberships affordable for residents
- Supporting holiday and special events
- Maintaining outdoor parks and athletic facilities
- Maintaining programs and services

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1. What will the tax dollars be used for?

- Operating the new Community and Recreation Center, which will include:
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2. How much will this cost me?

Residents will **pay only \$2.04 per month per \$100,000** property valuation.

3. Why does the Recreation Center need additional support?

When the levy to build the recreation center was on the ballot two years ago, this operational levy was also on the ballot but did not pass by a margin of 120 votes. The additional features in the new center, as well as its larger size, mean that it will cost more to operate.

4. What happens if it fails?

If the levy fails, community Parks and Recreation services and programs could be impacted. Additionally, facility operating hours may be reduced, free and reduced-cost programs and memberships may be eliminated and membership rates would drastically increase.

5. Will membership rates be the same at the new facility?

Membership rates will be directly affected by the result of this levy. **If it passes**, rates will remain at or near the same cost. **If it fails**, residents could see a serious increase in membership rates.
