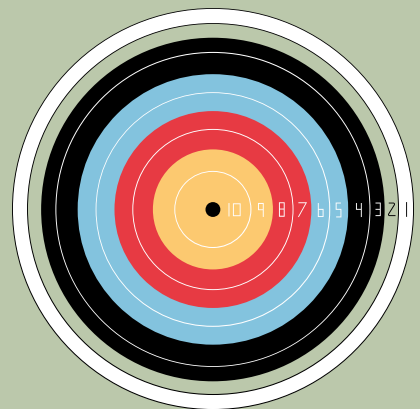
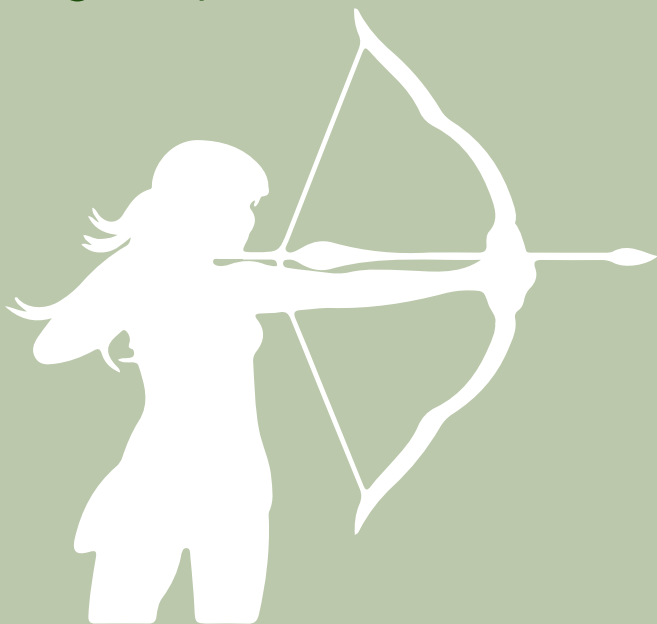
YOUTH SOCCER REFEREES NEEDED Are you interested in being a youth soccer referee? If you are 14 years old or older, have a strong knowledge of the game of soccer and are available Saturday mornings in April and May, we may have a spot for you as a youth soccer referee. Referees are paid \$25 to \$35 per game and will usually cover 2-3 games per weekend. Training is provided. ARCHERY Our introductory archery course aims to instruct students of all ages on how to shoot as safely as possible, as correctly as possible according to well-established professional standards, and as accurately as age, physicality, and available equipment will allow. Our archery class boosts ability, confidence, respect, and discipline while having fun. Classes are taught by Robert Schaefer and John Pfoh. Both of whom hold USA Archery Level 1 and Level 2 Instructor certifications.

Class meets once per week for 5 weeks. The first class of each session is MANDATORY for all students and parents of minors and will take place in our meeting room at 6 pm to review safety information.

The 4 remaining lessons will be in our Auxiliary Gym. To shoot in class, students must wear CLOSED-TOED shoes and a long-sleeved shirt (nothing bulky). If you have long hair, it must be pulled up. WINTER MAINTENANCE WINTER IS COMING AND YOU WILL BE SPENDING MORE TIME INDOORS; IT IS TIME TO MAKE SURE YOUR HOME IS PREPARED PROPERLY. COLDER TEMPERATURES CAN CREATE MULTIPLE ISSUES THAT CAN BE PREVENTED AND WILL SAVE YOUR POCKET BOOK...AND MAYBE A LIFE. HERE IS A SHORT LIST OF ITEMS TO CHECK ON OR MAINTAIN BEFORE THE FREEZING TEMPERATURES START.

- HAVE YOUR HVAC SYSTEM SERVICED AND CLEANED. IF CONNECTED TO THE CHIMNEY, THIS IS ALSO THE TIME TO HAVE THE FLUE LINER CHECKED AND REPAIRED IF NECESSARY. FURTHERMORE, HAVE THE FLUE FOR THE HOT WATER TANK CHECK AS WELL. IT IS ALSO RECOMMENDED THAT FIREPLACE CHIMNEY CLEANING AND SWEEPING ALSO BE DONE.
- ALL SMOKE DETECTORS AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS SHOULD BE UPDATED AND REPLACED IF NECESSARY. AT MINIMUM, ALL BATTERIES SHOULD ALSO BE REPLACED. SMOKE DETECTORS SHOULD BE PLACED WITHIN EACH BEDROOM AND AN ADDITIONAL ONE PER FLOOR.
- EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE ITEMS SHOULD INCLUDE: GUTTER CLEANING, TRIMMING LOW HANGING LIMBS OR LARGE LIMBS OVERHANGING POWER LINES (CALL CEI) OR OVERHANGING THE HOUSE, CLEANING SNOW AND ICE FROM ROOFS AND TREES (ALWAYS USE A TELESCOPE RAKE AND STAND A SAFE DISTANCE AWAY), WINTERIZING ANY EXPOSED WATERLINES INCLUDING HOSE BIBS.

SIGN-UP FOR EVENTS AND TRIPS Starting in January, our policy for signing up for trips will be modified. We will begin sign-ups for the following month by phone for shut-ins and in person for all Broadview Heights residents on the second Tuesday through the second Thursday of each month. After this initial 3 days of sign-ups, residents will be randomly picked for each trip up to the maximum allotted number (ex 12 or 24 passengers). Sign-ups for non-residents will begin on the second Friday of each month. Non-residents, in the order that they sign-up, will be added to trips as space remains. As always, our priority is to provide a variety of opportunities for community members to socialize and enjoy the company of others. We will continue to offer a wide array of options so that everyone has a chance to participate in multiple group activities and trips. The new policy will be implemented during January sign-ups for February trips.
