

Tee ball registration is open now. Register before March 15th for a discounted rate. The tee ball season will start practices in mid-May and begin games in June. Games end mid-July. Early start Tee Ball is a co-ed program for children ages 3 and 4. Teams are made up of 6-8 players. This is a fun, non-competitive game where parents are expected to participate with their child. For safety, foam bats and tee balls are used. Early Start Tee ball games begin mid-June and will run for 6 weeks. Games are played Saturday mornings between 9AM and Noon. If needed, a Noon start time may be added. Each child receives a team t-shirt. Registration deadline for Early Start is May 15th. Note: This is different than the regular tee ball deadline. 

HEAP APPLICATIONS

HEAP APPLICATIONS FOR 2024-25 is a federally funded program administered by the Ohio Development Services Agency (ODSA). It is designed to help eligible, low-income Ohioans meet the high costs of home heating. HEAP pays a one-time payment for most PUCO-regulated utility customers reflecting their usage for the current winter heating season. Apply via mail to Energy Assistance Programs P.O. Box 1240, Columbus, Ohio 43266-0583. HEAP applications can be downloaded from the ODOD website at www.development.ohio.gov or picked up at community action agencies, post offices and libraries. Note: Each household should mail only one application.
