ANNUAL HEALTH FAIR – Sat., June 1, 9AM-noon

The Human Services Departments of Broadview Heights and Brecksville will be hosting their annual joint Health Fair which has been tweaked to be of interest to ALL AGES. It will be held at the Broadview Heights Community Center, 9543 Broadview Road. There will be many physicians, hospitals, and other health care professionals to perform a variety of screenings (hearing, blood glucose, spinal screenings, stroke assessments, etc.) You can talk to a psychologist and learn about at-risk behaviors in adolescents, receive a free make-up product from a beauty expert, tour Metro Hospital's Life Flight, and get a chair massage. There will also be pharmacists to answer questions about drug interactions and Clear Choice Custom Lasik Center will be offering ice cream for a suggested charitable donation. All are welcome. Admission is FREE.

Fitness Expo at the Health Fair -- The Recreation Department is getting in on the act at the Health Fair by hosting a Fitness Expo consisting of FREE samplings of great group exercise programs offered at our Recreation Department. The class schedule is as follows:

The City of Broadview Heights is hosting a Community SHRED DAY on Sat., Aug. 10 at the Broadview Center. Residents may bring materials to be shredded between 9AM and noon. Limit 5 boxes per turn in line. Staples, fasteners, and paper clips need not be removed. Be prepared to show proof of residency.

FAQ’S (Frequently Asked Questions)

- **WHAT CAN THE CITY DO ABOUT HIGH GRASS ON PRIVATE PROPERTY?** This is a common property maintenance issue that is compounded by the high number of foreclosed and bank-owned properties in the city. When we learn about an unkempt property, we must research who currently owns the property. Then we must notify the owner of the infraction, and send a warning and completion deadline. If the grass is not cut after the required number of notifications, the City will arrange for the grass to be cut and bill the owner. Unfortunately, this is a long process that must be followed for legal reasons.
