**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

April is turning out to be “Ribbon Cutting Month” for us in Broadview Heights!

- **Cuyahoga County Emergency Operations Center**  
On April 2 at 11AM, we will host the ceremonial community groundbreaking for the new Cuyahoga County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to be built on the Broadview Center property behind the Police Station. The EOC will be a new, state-of-the-art facility that will make it easier for multi-agency coordination and response. It will include a robust communications center allowing the County to extend its dispatch capabilities. It will also have a large training center and a Special Operations Garage to house multi-jurisdictional public safety equipment and vehicles. Construction is expected to be completed in 2016.
- **Bob Evans** – The official Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony will be on April 6.
- **Great Clips** is moving to the Crossings Shopping Plaza and the Grand Re-Opening will be April 16.
- **Transitional REdesign**, located on Towpath Road, is a new company started by the owners of the fast-growing Transitional Treasures. It focuses on re-purposing old furniture and, not only has items for sale, but also offers workshops by local artists on how to do it yourself. The Ribbon-Cutting will be April 16.

## APRIL IS 9-1-1 AWARENESS MONTH

The Cuyahoga Emergency Communications System (CECOMS) and the Cuyahoga County Office of Emergency Management (CCOEM) encourages residents to keep the following in mind during an emergency:

- **9-1-1 NEEDS TO KNOW WHERE TO GO** – Be prepared to provide as much as information as possible about the location.
- **KNOW YOUR CELL WELL** – Texting 9-1-1 is not an option in most locales; you must dial 9-1-1 and speak with a dispatcher. Pull over when driving if possible to reduce the chance of a missed call.
- **9-1-1 IS FOR EMERGENCY ONLY** – when you need to save a life, stop a crime, or report a fire.
- **REMAIN CALM, BE PREPARED** – Even if the dispatcher is still asking questions or giving instructions, help is already on the way.
- **NEVER HANG UP!** If you get cut off, call back and explain that you were cut off.
