The City of Broadview Heights is accepting applications for an immediate opening for a part-time Head Lifeguard. All qualified candidates MUST possess current American Red Cross Water Safety Instructor and Lifeguard Instructor Certifications. Other desirable certifications include Certified Pool Operator and Babysitting Instructor. Duties include assisting the Aquatics Manager in general operation and maintenance of the facility. The Head Lifeguard also monitors Lifeguards and Water Safety Instructors to insure strict compliance with all policies and procedures. Other duties include interviewing, scheduling, skill testing, performing water tests, cleaning the facility, and overseeing the Learn-to-Swim Program and Splashpark. Must be available evening and weekends. Pay range is \$10.00-\$17.14 per hour. Mark your calendars and start setting aside your stuff! Habitat for Humanity is coming to the Broadview Center parking lot on **Saturday, April 16, from 9AM-1PM**. They will be accepting contributions of materials and furniture to help in their mission of providing suitable housing in northern Ohio. They welcome donations of construction/rehab materials, sinks, toilets, kitchen cabinets, vanities, doors, garden tools and supplies, tools (hand/electrical/battery), appliances (refrigerators, washers/dryers, stoves, microwaves), freezers, counter tops, shingles, bricks, air conditioners, dressers, lamps, wood (6'-8' lengths), drywall, furniture, etc. Items should be usable and complete. No paint, bedding or clothing. Schedule a pick-up of larger items by calling 216-429-3631. Tax receipts are available. **Donating these items keeps them out of the landfill!**

- **NEW GUIDELINES FOR DISPOSING OF MATTRESSES AND UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE**

Our trash contractor, Rumpke, has advised us that mattresses, sofas and upholstered chairs should be wrapped in plastic before placing them at the curb. This practice is to insure the health and safety of the workers. You can use painters' plastic which is available in the paint department of any store. Call Rumpke 24 hours in advance of your pick-up day to advise them of the large items: 440-746-0678. **Other guidelines can be found on the back page of the Town Planner Calendar that all residents received in December.**

- **FEEDING ANIMALS PROHIBITED**

Broadview Heights Ordinance 618.20(2) states, “No person shall provide food for dogs, cats, deer, geese, ducks, raccoons, fowl or other wild animals or wildlife by setting such food out on any public property or within a 150-yard radius of any private residence or public roadway. This section does not apply to animals owned by the person or to songbirds fed from a stationary bird feeder. Furthermore, (b) states that “Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor for the first offense and a fourth degree misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. Penalty shall be as provided in Section [202.99](#) of these Codified Ordinances.

- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** Please remember that Ordinance No. 452.05(c)(1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Ordinance 452.20(a) requires that signs be posted at city limits.
