NOVEMBER 8, 2016 PRESIDENTIAL GENERAL ELECTION – Be Election Ready

On November 8th voters will elect the next President of the United States. There also candidates for the US and Ohio Senate, US Congress and State House Representatives. This Presidential Election ballot also features County Council candidates, judicial seats, the Ohio Supreme Court, and State School Board members, as well as other important issues.

All Ohio registered voters will be mailed a Vote by Mail ballot application from the Ohio Secretary of State. But voters do not have to wait for this mailing. Vote by Mail ballot applications are available at the Board of Elections website: www.443VOTE.com, by calling the Board of Elections at 216-443-VOTE (8683), and at all public libraries.

The voter registration deadline is October 11th. Voters who have moved or changed their name since they last voted need to complete and return a new Voter Registration Card on, or before this deadline.

Early voting at the Board of Elections begins on October 12th. Early voting dates and hours are available on the Board of Elections website.

It is important for all voters to be prepared to cast their ballots. Sample ballots are available on the Board of Elections website: www.443VOTE.com.

- **LICENSED CONTRACTORS**

- **TREE RESPONSIBILITY**

We have had many issues with dead Ash trees due to the Emerald Ash Borer. Ash trees become very brittle and hazardous after they die. If an ash tree is located where it might be hazardous to pedestrians, automobiles or houses it should be removed. Residents often call with questions about removal of trees on their property, especially the tree

lawn. While the tree lawn is in the city's right-of-way, it does belong to the residents. Therefore, maintenance of trees in that area is the homeowners' responsibility. The city will, however, assist if the tree falls into the roadway. Tree companies that are registered with the city are listed alphabetically on the list of [Licensed Contractors \(linked here\)](#) from our website.

- **SOLICITING IN BROADVIEW HEIGHTS**
There are several ordinances that pertain to soliciting in Broadview Heights. In summary:
 - Section 828.04 limits the hours from **10am-8pm**.
 - Section 828.05 states that, *"..no person engaged in business...shall call at any residence in the City which displays a NO-SOLICITATION sign.*
 - Section 828.06 reads: *"Peddlers and solicitors shall use only residential sidewalks and driveways.."*
 - Section 828.07 reads: *"..no person engaged in business...shall call upon...any residence...which is at that time on the "Peddlers/Solicitors Do Not Call Registry".***Residents that do not want solicitors may put a NO SOLICITING sign in clear view on their door** and [APPLY ON-LINE](#) to be listed on the Do Not Knock list which is available by following the links on the home page of our website. www.broadview-heights.org
- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** Please remember that Ordinance No. 452.05(c)(1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Ordinance 452.20(a) requires that signs be posted at city limits.
