GAME-DAY RECYCLING SUGGESTIONS

The big football game is coming and the excitement is growing! But the big game and the parties that accompany it generate a lot of trash. Unfortunately, all disposable paper and plastic plates, cups, and silverware cannot be recycled. Do not place them in with the recycling. Here are some suggestions for reducing waste:

- If you need more glasses/plates/silverware than you have on-hand, you can buy them very inexpensively at thrift and discount stores. Then you can put them in the dishwasher – instead of sending them to the landfill. Store them in a box till your next event.
- Consider a decorative or event-themed reusable cup as a fun party favor. Have the guests write their name on them. These are often used for years, instead of hours.
- Serve beverages from large containers and dispensers instead of purchasing single bottles or cans of water and soda.
- If you must use single-use items, opt for fiber-based or compostable cups.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT...

- **NO PARKING ON CITY STREETS WHEN SNOWFALL EXCEEDS 2"**
Ordinance 452.13 specifies that a snow-emergency parking ban exists when snowfall exceeds 2" in a 24-hour period. Use common sense when parking in the street during the winter so that the roads can be properly cleared.
- **A GLIMPSE OF WHAT THE GOLDMAN SACHS 10,000 SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAM CAN DO FOR YOUR BUSINESS:**

- **HUMAN SERVICES OVERNIGHT BUS TRIP TO LIGONIER**
The bus will leave Sunday morning, April 30 and return Monday evening, May 1. Hotel accommodations will be at the Ramada Ligonier. The itinerary includes Sunday brunch at DiSalvo's historic Station Restaurant, a guided tour of the Compass Inn Museum and Fort Ligonier, welcome reception at the Ramada, murder mystery dinner show, hearty breakfast at the hotel, guided tour of Frank Lloyd Wright's Fallingwater, Flight 93 National Memorial & Visitor's Center. The trip cost is \$250pp (single) or \$200pp (double) and includes transportation, lodging, one brunch, one dinner, one breakfast, all attractions and entertainment, welcome reception, baggage handling, parting gift, and all taxes/gratuities.
- **UPDATE ON THE NEW COMMUNITY AND RECREATION CENTER**
ADDITION: The layout of the new Broadview Heights Community and Recreation Center has been finalized. We have now moved into the Design Development phase in which we are hosting meetings with Braun & Steidl Architects, Barker Rinker Seacat Architects, Water Technologies Inc., and Panzica Construction to further develop the plans for each space within the facility as well as the exterior of the building. - **E-COMMERCE SAFE SPOT:** Private sales through the internet are becoming very popular. Sites such as Letgo and OfferUp have joined Craig's List in enticing the public with great deals and unusual offerings. The downside is that buyers and sellers must meet somewhere to make the sale, and this can be an unsafe situation if one or the other is unscrupulous. In Broadview Heights we recognize that some great legitimate sales can

be made which benefit all parties. We have partnered with a local business to create a safe spot so that these transactions can take place. John Luke of Stouffer Realty offered to sponsor the site and sign. The Broadview Heights Safe Spot will be located in the front parking lot near the pavilion on the Broadview Center property—an area that has surveillance cameras and is regularly traveled by the officers. There is a sign to mark the spot. Registration is not required to use the Safe Spot. E-Commerce participants will be able to seal their deals in a safe environment.

- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** Please remember that Ordinance No. 452.05(c)(1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Ordinance 452.20(a) requires that signs be posted at city limits.
