## IN CASE YOU MISSED IT...

- **EVERY ROAD BRIDGE TO CLOSE MARCH 13**  
The Department of Public Works will replace Avery Road Bridge over Chippewa Creek. The road will be closed at the bridge. Avery Road will be open to local traffic only. Detour signs will be posted. The anticipated completion date is December, 2017. Funding is provided by Cuyahoga County Vehicle License Tax Fund and Federal Funding.
- **COMMUNITY SHRED DAY – APRIL 8:** The City is sponsoring its Annual Shred Day on Saturday, April 8, 9:00AM – 12:00PM. Residents can bring their private documents to be shredded on-site. Staples, fasteners and paper clips do NOT need to be removed. There is no charge, but all are asked to bring non-perishable (unexpired) food items or paper products for the Broadview Heights Food Bank. The limit is 5

boxes/bags per turn in line. Bring proof of Broadview Heights residency. No business shredding please.

- **HUMAN SERVICES OVERNIGHT BUS TRIP TO LIGONIER:** The bus will leave Sunday morning, April 30 and return Monday evening, May 1. Hotel accommodations will be at the Ramada Ligonier. The itinerary includes Sunday brunch at DiSalvo's historic Station Restaurant, a guided tour of the Compass Inn Museum and Fort Ligonier, welcome reception at the Ramada, murder mystery dinner show, hearty breakfast at the hotel, guided tour of Frank Lloyd Wright's Fallingwater, Flight 93 National Memorial & Visitor's Center. - **SAFETY TOWN REGISTRATION – APRIL 5, 2017:** This 10-day summer educational program instructs pre-kindergarten aged children with interactive activities on crossing the street, traffic lights, seat belts, bus safety, the work of police officers and firefighters, bike safety, and more. The focus is on safety skills used on a daily basis in a child's life. Using a simulated mini-town (complete with buildings and roads), the children use tricycles with seat belts to practice and experience a variety of situations so that they may respond decisively when confronted with those same situations in real life. The serious subject of safety is combined with crafts, songs, and fun. They also work on learning their phone number and address. Classes are June 12-23, 9-11AM or 12:30-2:30PM. The cost is \$35. Open registration will take place Wednesday, April 5, 4:00-5:30PM at the Broadview Heights Police Kloka Training Facility (across from the Police Department), 9543 Broadview Road.
- **LEASE TRASH CARTS:** Broadview Heights residents can lease trash carts with lids from Rumpke. A 96-gallon solid-waste cart is \$3 per month and a 64-gallon recycling cart is \$2.25 per month. - **UPDATE ON THE NEW COMMUNITY AND RECREATION CENTER**  
**ADDITION:** The layout of the new Broadview Heights Community and Recreation Center has been finalized. We have now moved into the Design Development phase in which we are hosting meetings with Braun & Steidl Architects, Barker Rinker Seacat Architects, Water Technologies Inc., and Panzica Construction to further develop the plans for each space within the facility as well as the exterior of the building. - **E-COMMERCE SAFE SPOT:** Private sales through the internet are becoming very popular. Sites such as Letgo and OfferUp have joined Craig's List in enticing the public with great deals and unusual offerings. The downside is that buyers and sellers must

meet somewhere to make the sale, and this can be an unsafe situation if one or the other is unscrupulous. In Broadview Heights we recognize that some great legitimate sales can be made which benefit all parties. We have partnered with a local business to create a safe spot so that these transactions can take place. John Luke of Stouffer Realty offered to sponsor the site and sign. The Broadview Heights Safe Spot will be located in the front parking lot near the pavilion on the Broadview Center property—an area that has surveillance cameras and is regularly traveled by the officers. There is a sign to mark the spot. Registration is not required to use the Safe Spot. E-Commerce participants will be able to seal their deals in a safe environment.

- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** Please remember that Ordinance No. 452.05(c)(1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Ordinance 452.20(a) requires that signs be posted at city limits.
