RECYCLING: KEEP IT SIMPLE

There are only five (5) main materials categories:

1. Cans
2. Cartons
3. Glass
4. Paper & boxes (flatten boxes)
5. Plastic bottles & jugs (leave caps/lids ON)

When considering plastics....if the item is shaped like a bottle and it has a neck, cap or lid, it belongs in curbside recycling. When you hold an item in your hand, ask yourself “Is it a bottle, jar, jug or a tub?” If you answer YES, recycle it. If you answer NO, throw it out with the regular trash—even if you used to recycle it, or if you aren’t sure if it qualifies. It is more important now to have a clean recycling stream so the material recovery facilities don’t spend unnecessary time removing contaminated items.

IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

- **HUMAN SERVICES SURVEY:** Human Services is utilizing Kerri Holdash, Master of Public Health student at Kent State, who is completing her practicum project which is a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) at various locations throughout Cuyahoga County (one location being the Broadview Heights Human Services Department.) The focus is to identify the aging-in-place process. We will be assisting Kerri in collecting data by distributing surveys, scheduling interviews, and arranging focus groups. Once the data is collected, we will be able to present the findings back to the community. To participate, [download and complete the survey](#) and return it to the Human Services Department at the Community Building. Surveys are also available at the Department. This survey will not only assist in grant-writing, but will also help determine if we are offering the right programs and services.
- **SENIOR FOCUS GROUP:** The Human Services Department is looking for members in the community over the age of 60 that would be willing to participate in a focus group (a group discussion about a particular top). Topics include questions about time they have spent living in the community as well as questions about their thoughts on the future. The session is expected to last 20-30 minutes. - **TOLLIS SANITARY SEWER:** The relining of the Tollis sanitary sewer will begin the week of January 28. Work will be performed by Layne Inlier. There will be no anticipated disruptions to sanitary sewer service. The relining includes a trenchless rehabilitation of the sanitary sewer and, therefore, disruption to traffic will be at a minimum. Driveway access may be interrupted due to repair; however, this inconvenience will be kept to a minimum. Work can occur between the hours of 7AM-7PM (Ord. 149-94). The 2018 Charter Review Commission will begin meeting this month. The committee consists of representatives from various wards, city boards and commissions, Council and the Mayor.
