### **PUBLIC SERVICE DEPARTMENT**

The Broadview Heights Hazardous Household Waste program will no longer accept standard propane tanks (20#) effective immediately. Blue Rhino propane locations now offer a free recycling program for 20# grill tanks. Anyone can recycle an unwanted grill tank by writing “RECYCLE” on the tank and taking it to a Blue Rhino location. ## IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

- **SNOW PLOW PERMITS:** Broadview Heights Ordinance #840.01 states that "... Any person who contracts or performs snow removal services in the City, on other than his or her own personal property, and for compensation, shall make application to the Mayor's office for a snow removal permit for each snow removal vehicle used by such applicant in the City..." - **FOR SAFETY'S SAKE ... ADDRESS YOUR MAILBOX:** As the harsh winter conditions continue, take a moment and check your mail box -- not the inside, but the proper address number identification on the outside of the box. Both the heat of summer and the cold of winter can fade decals, or render the adhesive ineffective causing the numbers to fall off. Our Police and Fire Departments appreciate visible and reliable numbering on your mail box. Help them find you faster with good address identification. To help you understand what that means, the Building Code reads as follows: *1324.01 "The house number on each mailbox shall be inscribed in neat numbers not less than two inches high on each side of the mailbox, or on the door of the house if the boxes are grouped. Advertising on mailboxes or supports is prohibited."*
- **THE BROADVIEW HEIGHTS FOOD BANK** is in need of non-expired/non-perishable food items. Specific items that are needed: boxed potatoes, rice or rice mixes, canned meat, oatmeal, cereal/breakfast bars, nuts, shelf stable milk and milk substitutes, canned stews, and canned fruit. Please bring the items to the Broadview Heights Human Services Department located on the main floor the Community Building. Your generosity is appreciated by all who are served.
- **REGION-WIDE ROAD SALT SHORTAGE:** The region-wide road salt shortage is causing salt to be rationed and is currently affecting Broadview Heights and our neighboring communities. Although Cargill will continue to provide our communities with salt, it will be in limited quantities. In order to maintain our salt supply, Broadview Heights will prioritize salt distribution to areas where necessary such as hills, main roads, intersections and curves. Thank you for your understanding and patience and as always, please exercise caution while driving in hazardous conditions.

- **SEEKING PART-TIME, SEASONAL SERVICE WORKERS:** The Broadview Heights Service Department is now accepting applications. Duties include general labor and landscaping. Must be able to lift items over 50 lbs. and have the ability to operate a motor vehicle. Pay rate starts at \$9/hour. Must be available to work daytime hours Monday through Friday. - **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES:** **Recycle these items:** Water/beverage bottles with caps on; beverage jugs (milk, juice, etc.) with caps on; food jars (mayonnaise, peanut butter, etc.) with caps on; plastic tubs and lids (yogurt, cottage cheese, etc.); laundry, shampoo and soap containers with caps on. **Do NOT recycle these items:** Fruit and lettuce containers (thermoform trays); produce, deli & bakery trays; plastic bags, wraps, film; cups (Solo cups, coffee cups); utensils and plates; fast food containers and cups, take-out containers (Styrofoam and molded plastic); bulky plastic (lawn chairs, crates, buckets, Little Tykes/Step 2 products); clothes hangers; toys, flower pots, straws, Styrofoam.

- **BROADVIEW HEIGHTS SAFETY TOWN:** The Broadview Heights Safety Town is a 10-day summer educational program that instructs pre-kindergarten-aged children about crossing the street, traffic lights, seat belts, bus safety, the work of police officers and firefighters, bike safety, and more using interactive activities. Classes are scheduled for June 11-22, 2018 (morning session 9-11AM; afternoon session 12:30-2:30PM). Broadview Heights Resident Non-Members will receive the discounted drop-in rate of \$7 at the Seven Hills Recreation Center during the Broadview Heights pool closure. Proof of residency required. - **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
