ANNUAL EASTER EGG HUNT – SAT., MAR. 24, 10AM

HUMAN SERVICES

- **PROPOSED BUS TRIP:** Plans are being made for a two-day bus trip to Seneca Niagara Casino & Resort in June, 2018. The package will include motor coach transportation; a one-night stay at the casino complex; gaming dollars and food voucher; Maid of the Mist ride; Adventure Theatre; a visit to the “Made in America Store”; lunch. The cost will be approximately \$199-\$214 per person for double-occupancy. The trip will be booked if enough people are interested. Please call 440-526-4685 to let us know you will be coming. - **FREE MEDICINE REVIEWS:** Participating pharmacies around the State will provide free, confidential medicine reviews for older adults who visit their locations. Pharmacy staff will review customers’ medicine usage and identify those medicines and combinations that may increase the risk for falls. Customers will receive a list of their potentially

TRASH IS DIRTY BUSINESS!

Here are some reminders about trash pickup. [Click here for other guidelines.](#)

- **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
- **DISPOSAL OF PROPANE TANKS:** The Broadview Heights Hazardous Household Waste program will no longer accept standard propane tanks (20#) effective immediately. Blue Rhino propane locations now offer a free recycling program for 20# grill tanks. Anyone can recycle an unwanted grill tank by writing "RECYCLE" on the tank and taking it to a Blue Rhino location. Blue Rhino will accept any standard 20# grill tank, including non-Rhino brands. [More information](#) is available here.
- **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES: Recycle these items:** Water/beverage bottles with caps on; beverage jugs (milk, juice, etc.) with caps on; food jars (mayonnaise, peanut butter, etc.) with caps on; plastic tubs and lids (yogurt, cottage cheese, etc.); laundry, shampoo and soap containers with caps on. **Do NOT recycle these items:** Fruit and lettuce containers (thermoform trays); produce, deli & bakery trays; plastic bags, wraps, film; cups (Solo cups, coffee cups); utensils and plates; fast food containers and cups, take-out containers (Styrofoam and molded plastic); bulky plastic (lawn chairs, crates, buckets, Little Tykes/Step 2 products); clothes hangers; toys, flower pots, straws, Styrofoam.

MAY 8 PRIMARY ELECTION

Ballot items include candidates for Governor, statewide offices, US Senate, US Congress, State House and Senate. The County Executive and some members of County Council as well as judicial candidates will also be on the ballot. This Partisan Primary Election is an opportunity for Democratic, Republican and Green party voters to select the candidates who will advance to the November General Election. - **COMMUNITY SHRED DAY:** The City is sponsoring its Annual Shred Day on **Saturday, April 7th, 9:00AM – 12:00PM**. Residents can bring their private documents to be shredded on-site. residency. No business shredding please! There is no charge, but all are asked to bring non-perishable (unexpired) food items or paper products for the Broadview Heights Food Bank. Specific items needed include boxed potatoes, rice or rice mixes, canned meat, oatmeal, cereal/breakfast bars, nuts, shelf stable milk and milk substitutes, canned stews and canned fruit.

- **HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE OPTIONS:** FirstEnergy's Ohio utilities (Ohio Edison, The Illuminating Company and Toledo Edison) provided the following information about its public assistance programs. The late winter months often bring an elevated number of customer complaints about higher-than-expected utility bills, usually because the cold snaps in January and February result in customers using more energy than usual.
