HYDRANT FLUSHING BEGINS

The Fire Department will be flushing water mains and fire hydrants from now through July. This work is being done as part of the Fire Department's ongoing preventative maintenance program. Generally, the hydrants are flushed during the hours of 9AM-4PM, Monday through Friday. Signs will be posted at the end of each street and at the entranceway to developments the day before flushing begins. IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

- **CULVERT REPLACEMENT AT THE FIELDS – ROAD CLOSURE:** The road that runs along the end of soccer field C, between baseball diamonds #1-7 and the soccer fields, is currently closed due to an emergency culvert replacement project. You can only access baseball diamonds #1-7 from Royalwood. You can only access the soccer fields and baseball diamond #8 from Lazzaro. There is a drop off zone at the edge of soccer field C for those who cannot walk down to that field from the parking lot. This drop off zone is accessible from Lazzaro only.
- **MEDICAL WASTE AND DRUGS** (prescription and over-the-counter) are not permitted to be dropped off in the hazardous household waste program. Medications can be dropped off at any police station that has a medicine drop box. The closest are Seven

Hills Police at 7325 Summitview Drive and North Royalton Police at 14000 Bennett Road. Additional information regarding medical waste [can be found here](#).

- **RECREATION CENTER UPDATE:** To make way for the renovations included in the new Community and Recreation Center project, the existing pool has been closed along with the aquatic offices and support spaces. The closed areas have been cleared out by the Parks and Recreation Department and the Service Department staff, and Panzica's demo work has begun. Our partnership with the City of Seven Hills, which took effect on April 1, provides our patrons with pool access while we are without a pool. Many of our members and residents have been taking advantage of the opportunity to use the aquatic facilities in Seven Hills. The staff at the Seven Hills Recreation Center has been very welcoming.

The concrete slab has been poured in the locker rooms and the mechanical, electrical and plumbing along with the masonry work is underway in that area. The concrete slab has been poured in the gymnasium and the track is being installed around the perimeter. The new natatorium is taking shape and the concrete has been poured for the new pool. The natatorium roofing is being completed and the roofing over the rest of the building is already complete. The project is still running on schedule with an anticipated opening date between October and December of 2018. - **COMMUNITY GARAGE SALE:** The City of Broadview Heights will be hosting its third annual COMMUNITY GARAGE SALE around the City on Saturday, June 9, 2018, starting at 9AM. Those who live in a neighborhood where the H.O.A. does not allow garage sales, or those that do not wish to have the sale at their home may reserve space at the Broadview Center parking lot from 9AM-2PM. The event will be held rain or shine. **(Note: No three-day regular garage sale permits will be issued for that weekend.)** The registration fee will cover:
 - Publicity in the local papers, website, electronic sign, the mayor's weekly email, Facebook, and signage.
 - A 20'x20' space in the parking lot for a vehicle and the display (participants must provide their own tables/tents)... OR...the permit for those who hold the sale at their home.
 - Inclusion on a downloadable listing of garage sale addresses, plus a summary of sale items which will be posted on the city website and made available at the front desk.

Register by Friday, June 1, on-line at www.bhrec.org or stop at the front desk of the Community Building. The cost to participate is \$10 for Rec Center Members; \$15 for Broadview Heights Residents.

- **TRASH COLLECTION REMINDERS:**
 - **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
 - **DISPOSAL OF PROPANE TANKS:** The Broadview Heights Hazardous Household Waste program will no longer accept standard propane tanks (20#) effective immediately. Blue Rhino propane locations now offer a free recycling program for 20# grill tanks. Anyone can recycle an unwanted grill tank by writing "RECYCLE" on the tank and taking it to a Blue Rhino location. Blue Rhino will accept any standard 20# grill tank, including non-Rhino brands. [More information](#) is available here.

- **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES: Recycle these items:** Water/beverage bottles with caps on; beverage jugs (milk, juice, etc.) with caps on; food jars (mayonnaise, peanut butter, etc.) with caps on; plastic tubs and lids (yogurt, cottage cheese, etc.); laundry, shampoo and soap containers with caps on. **Do NOT recycle these items:** Fruit and lettuce containers (thermoform trays); produce, deli & bakery trays; plastic bags, wraps, film; cups (Solo cups, coffee cups); utensils and plates; fast food containers and cups, take-out containers (Styrofoam and molded plastic); bulky plastic (lawn chairs, crates, buckets, Little Tykes/Step 2 products); clothes hangers; toys, flower pots, straws, Styrofoam.
