- **SCAM ALERT:** The Cuyahoga County Department of Consumer Affairs is warning residents to hang up on Social Security scam calls. In these scams, callers try to scare people into paying to keep their Social Security accounts from being frozen or seized. Occasionally, scammers will even claim the person's Social Security number has been linked to a crime scene involving drugs or bodies. Consumer Affairs wants you to know that real government agencies don't call people with threats to seize their accounts. And legitimate agencies NEVER ask people to move their money to new accounts to avoid seizure. To protect yourself from scams, let unknown calls go to voicemail – and don't call hang-up numbers back out of curiosity. Delete all messages that threaten you with arrest or seizure of your accounts or property. And if you accidentally pick up a threatening call, hang up immediately. BABY DEER – ABANDONED OR NOT?

It is important for everyone to realize that deer do not abandon their young. Fawns, like many other wild animal babies, are frequently hidden and left alone for hours by their mothers while they forage for food. For the first couple of weeks, these babies generally nap while waiting for their mothers to return. They lay very still so as not to attract predators (like well-intentioned human animals), and are frequently mistaken for being in distress or abandoned. If roaming about, they may appear to be weak and stumbling, and actually are newly born. Their mothers are usually within visual range, and can always hear if their baby cries out. - **ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS:**
 - **Aquatic Positions:** To apply for Water Safety Instructor, Lifeguard, or Head Lifeguard, [email resume](#) to Aquatics Manager Amanda Hutcheson, or complete and return an application (available at the front desk). [Online Application / Job Descriptions](#).
- **GUIDELINES FOR BLOCK PARTIES AND FOOD TRUCK VISITS:** Notify the Mayor's office of plans to hold a Block Party or visit by a food truck. Include date, time, rain date (if applicable), location, and a sketch or map if blocking of a street is requested. Email to cityhall@broadview-heights.org, or send a letter to the Mayor's Office, City of Broadview Heights, 9543 Broadview Road, Broadview Heights, OH 44147. You will receive a response within 5 business days.
 - **Blocking of the Street** is not permitted unless there is an alternate access to residences beyond the point of the gathering. Items such as tables, games, grills, etc. are not permitted to be in the street. Blocked roads are only to protect people who may be walking through the area. Blocked roads must be opened by dark.
 - **Food Trucks** must be inspected and approved by the Fire Department per Ordinance 1650.08. Have the operator call 440-526-4493. Parking is allowed only on the non-hydrant side of the street for one hour.
- **HYDRANT FLUSHING:** The Fire Department will be flushing water mains and fire hydrants from May 20-August 20, 2019. This work will be done as part of the Fire Department's ongoing preventative maintenance program. Generally, this work will be done during the hours of 9:00AM-4:00PM, Monday through Friday. Signs will be posted at the end of each street and entranceway to developments, the day before flushing begins. We understand and appreciate your efforts in landscaping your property, but remember not to obstruct the hydrants with long grasses and/or shrubs. - **SANITARY SEWER ISSUES – FLUSHABLE WIPES:** Over the past few years we have experienced escalating issues in our sanitary sewer system caused by unsuitable materials being flushed down toilets. The increased use of "flushable" wipes has caused major clogging issues in the pump stations and, in some cases, house lateral lines. Even though the box states that they are flushable, they do not degrade quickly enough and accumulate to clog the pumps and pipes. **Please do not flush anything except toilet paper!** Thank you for your cooperation.
- **MEALS ON WHEELS:** The Department of Human Services is the headquarters for the Brecksville and Broadview Heights Meals on Wheels Program. If you or any member of your family find it difficult to

prepare your own meals due to recent surgery or incapacity, call 440-526-2499 to be guided through the process. The meals are provided Monday through Friday every day except holidays.

- **SOLICITING IN BROADVIEW HEIGHTS:** It's the time of year when solicitors begin their door-to-door sales. Section 828.04 of our Codified Ordinances limits the hours of solicitation from 10:00AM to 8:00PM Section 828.05 states that, "...no person engaged in business...shall call at any residence in the City which displays a NO-SOLICITATION sign. Section 828.06 reads: "Peddlers and solicitors shall use only residential sidewalks and driveways..." Section 828.07 reads: "...no person engaged in business...shall call upon...any residence...which is at that time on the 'Peddlers/Solicitors Do Not Call Registry.' **If you do not want solicitors, please put a NO SOLICITING sign in a visible place on your door.** If a solicitor ignores your sign, call the police at that time. Note: Even if you are on the [DO NOT KNOCK LIST](#), you need to have a NO SOLICITING sign on your door.
- **HOME REPAIR LOAN INFORMATION:** The Neighborhood Housing Services (NHS) of Greater Cleveland offers a Home Repair Loan Program to residents of Cuyahoga County. Highlights of the program include loans from \$5,000-\$60,000 with flexible terms up to 30 years and rates of 4.99-6.5%. There are no minimum credit score requirements. Registration for this notification service is customized, allowing residents to choose which alerts they would like to sign up for and their preferred manner of receipt. - **ITEMS THAT ARE NOT ACCEPTED AT OUR HAZARDOUS WASTE SERVICE GARAGE DROP OFF LOCATIONS:**
 - **LATEX PAINT** is NOT hazardous waste. Please dry it out at home and put with the regular trash with the lid off so the drivers can see that it is dried out. You can mix the paint with kitty litter, sawdust, or a purchased drying agent available anywhere that paint is sold.
 - **MEDICAL WASTE:** Unused medications can be taken to the North Royalton, Seven Hills, or Brecksville police departments and placed in the drug disposal box in their respective lobbies.
 - **CFL LIGHT BULBS** (the curly ones) should be taken to *Lowes, Home Depot, or Batteries+* for recycling (15312 Pearl Road; phone 440-571-0002 or 440-571-0016).
 - **FLUORESCENT TUBE LIGHTS** should be taken to *Batteries+*.
 - **PROPANE TANKS** (20 lb. regular grill tanks) can be taken to any business that sells Blue Rhino propane. Write "RECYCLE" on the empty tank.
 - **TELEVISIONS AND MICROWAVES** are NOT accepted in the computer round-up drop-off location! Tube televisions under 32", flat screens under 50", and portable televisions can be taken to any Best Buy for recycling (please call Best Buy ahead, fees may be charged).
 - **SINGLE-USE ALKALINE BATTERIES** can be safely discarded in your regular trash.Additional information can be found at <http://cuyahogarecycles.org>.

CITY RULES & REGULATIONS

- **BUILDING DEPARTMENT REMINDERS:** All contractors performing work in the City must be registered. The majority of projects that require hiring a contractor also require a permit. Permits cards must be displayed on the property in a place visible from the street. Projects requiring contractor registration and permits also require inspections by the Building Department. Specific to roofers, an “ice guard” inspection is required prior to installing shingles. Contact the Building Department with any questions. 440-526-6864.

- **MINORS CURFEW:** Per [Chapter 648.10](#) of the Broadview Heights Code of Ordinances the curfew age & hours are as follows:

Age	Hours
Through 12	Darkness to 6:30AM
13 through 15	10:00PM to 6:00AM
16 through 17	11:00PM to 6:00AM, Sunday through Thursday
16 through 17	Midnight to 6:00AM, Friday and Saturday

- **CURBSIDE RECYCLING GUIDELINES: Simply put, listed are the items that are recyclable:** Plastic Bottles & Jugs, Glass Bottles & Jars, Cartons, Metal Cans, and Paper & Cardboard. Throw away the lids in regular trash unless they are still on the original container (tightly). **When in doubt throw it out (in the garbage that is).** Click on this link for tips on recycling the right way [Cuyahoga Recycles](#). - **NOISE ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO OUTDOOR EQUIPMENT:** No person shall use engine or motor-powered garden, lawn or maintenance tools intended for repetitive use in landscaping in residential areas, typically capable of being used by homeowners, including garden tools, riding tractors, walking tractors and power mowers, between the hours of 8:00PM of any day and 8:00AM of the following day. **Note: Hours vary for construction and roadwork.**
- **TRIMMING OF TREE LAWN TREES:** Please help us be a “walkable” community by pruning the trees on your tree lawn. The Shade Tree Commission recommends a minimum height of 6’6”. This will help keep our pedestrians and bike-riders safe.
- **ALL GARBAGE IS TO BE PUT OUT BY 7:00AM:** Due to weather conditions, holidays, call-offs, etc. the normal pick up times will vary. Do NOT rely on the time that trash has been picked up in the past.
- **SOLICITING IN BROADVIEW HEIGHTS:** There are several ordinances that pertain to [soliciting in Broadview Heights](#). All ordinances are located on our [website](#).
- **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING ON CITY STREETS:** [Codified Ordinance](#) section 452.05(c) (1) prohibits parking on city streets between the hours of 3:00AM and 6:00AM. Per Codified Ordinance section 452.20 (a), signs are posted at city limits.
