LETTER FROM NOPEC

The City has an aggregation contract with First Energy Solutions through NOPEC (Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council). By law, every three years they must send an opt-out mailer to all electric customers in the community. It allows customers to opt-out without paying any fees. NOPEC electricity customers have three options: 1) Do not make any changes to the electricity discount program; 2) Enroll in another NOPEC product (visit www.fes.com/nopec for options); or 3) Return the form and opt out of the program.
